REGARDING THE CREATION OF AN IN-HOUSE COUNSEL POSITION

Proposed by David Berkoff

- Rationale: To create an in-house counsel position rather than have a volunteer as legal counsel. The proposal would save on the cost of outside legal counsel by bringing minor legal matters and Board of Review issues in-house and would allow the Board and Executive Director to have immediate feedback on legal matters.
- Motion: In-House Counsel of USA Swimming shall be a paid position within USA Swimming. In-House Counsel shall be hired by the Executive Director with approval of the Board of Directors. In-House Counsel shall provide legal counsel on various day-to-day aspects and issues as they arise and as assigned by the Executive Director, shall direct any and all USAS Board of Review matters, and shall provide objective legal advice to the Board of Directors at all meetings.
- **Recommendation:** The Rules and Regulations Committee recommends rejection because staff hires and staff matters are not under the purview of the House of Delegates, the rulebook or the Board of Directors. Except for the Executive Director, no other staff person hire requires the approval of the Board of Directors and it is bad governance to provide for such.
