2008 Olympic Trials. The team of officials selected to work the 2008 Olympic Team Trials – Swimming in Omaha, Nebraska this year has been finalized. For a complete list, *click here*.

Applications to Officiate. Applications to officiate at this year's national meets have been posted. They include applications for the U.S. Open Championship and the Speedo Junior National Championships, both in Minneapolis, MN, and the USA Swimming Short Course National Championships in December in Atlanta, GA. Remember, you are responsible for applying for recertification, it is not automatic. A recently certified Stroke and Turn official working a 10 & under backstroke event raises his hand to signal a possible disqualification. When approached by the Chief Judge to discuss the observed infraction the official explains that the swimmer in lane 3 is wearing nose plugs, which constitutes using an artificial device to enhance performance.
