- Reliefs

Meet Flow

Admin requirements

- Radio checks Time
- Assignment sheets issued accordingly
- Watch Officials in your quadrant for protocol, calls and reliefs
 - Vetting calls
 - Remind Officials of next stroke
- CJs work as a TEAM

Odds & Ends

- Relay take offs
 - Ref/starter rotation
- Lane timer sheets
- Chairs and towels
- Bells, counters and sheets for distance
- CJ's work as a team stay in the game
- OTS entry
- Labels for shirts
